## IT IS HARD TO HAVE PEACE IN THIS WORLD

Beloved at Mt. Zion,

You probably heard or read about the Whitewater Center closing June 24 due to the discovery of a potentially fatal amoeba. The amoeba apparently caused the death of a teenager the week before. We were proud of my 11 year old grandson for doing so well in 5th grade and for an end-of-year reward, gave him an experience—a day at the Whitewater Center. Connor was on a raft at the Whitewater Center when the water tested positive for the amoeba and the river was shut down.

He and I were talking about it the next day.

He was, understandably, shaken and his bright young mind was racing. Like we all do, he started with the scariest possibilities. What if he had gotten the meningitis-causing amoeba?

Of course, my own mind was racing too.

I don't think scary things and freak accidents are new. But the non-stop coverage and graphic details are new as never before. It is hard to have peace in this world.

Connor is at Camp Tekoa this week – and in our conversation, we were talking about what an important life skill it is to not freak out when terrible things happen. He talked about the 2 year old that was killed by the shark two weeks ago at Disney World. And I did not even tell him about the 14 year old who died unexpectedly in Greensboro two weeks ago – the first grandson of a good friend of mine.

It is hard to have peace in this world.

The turmoil makes it all the more important to stay very close to Christ. He promised us a peace the world can't give and the world can't take away. It is the only source of true peace. My Connor is only 11. But he already needs to know that the only true source of peace in this world comes through Jesus. By the time you get this email, more tragic things will have happened. And we will be able to claim the story to our children, our grandchildren, and our friends about Jesus—who gives us peace that the world can't give or take away. *Mary John*



Appalachia Service Project 2016! We

would like to thank everyone for your support of the 2016 Youth Mission trip to Lincoln Co. WV June 19-25th. We took 18 high school students and 10 adults for a great week deep in the mountains of West Virginia. Little did we know, this would be the same week that would send some of the worst rain in many years to WV. Our 4 work

crews each were sent to different homes where we spent all week getting to know the families and helping make their homes warmer, safer, and dryer. We were the first work crews for the summer in this particular area, so we were charged with the task of building a strong initial relationship with each family, as well as starting the initial work on their homes. Some of the projects we worked on included building a 5'x5' deck with stairs, replacing a bathroom floor, installing fascia and soffit, replacing OSB and dry wall in a bedroom, installing new foundation piers, and putting on a tin roof. All of these tasks were slowed when the rains came early in the week and rarely seemed to let up. When we were slowed by the rain, we were able to spend more time with the families. The only real "problem" we had was a power outage at the center on Thursday night for about 5 hours and some power outages at the work sites which made some of the construction more difficult. All in all we had a wonderful time and all made it home safely. We are so blessed to have a church like Mt. Zion that is so supportive of this great ministry. We look forward to where God leads us in 2017! Registration for next year begins in late fall 2016. -Matt Sherrill



**DISCIPLE BIBLE STUDY** classes to begin in August! We are excited to offer three levels of **DISCIPLE** this year.

Brian Polly will be leading DISCIPLE 1: BECOMING DISCIPLES THROUGH BIBLE STUDY on Sunday afternoons. Brian is a gifted and insightful teacher with a number of years' experience teaching DISCIPLE. The 34 week study gives the Old and New Testaments equal time, emphasizing the

wholeness of the Bible as a revelation of God. **DisciPLE** draws upon the work of scholars, the personal Bible reading and study of the participant, and dynamic group discussion to aid understanding of the Bible.

**DISCIPLE 2: INTO THE WORD INTO THE WORLD** will be led by **Jeff Knight**. Jeff is a passionate, seminary trained leader who will offer great insight as you explore, together, our calling to study God's word and to take it into the world. This 32 week study offers a deeper examination of Genesis, Exodus, Luke and Acts, emphasizing the rhythm of coming to God and going for God... approaching all experiences of life as opportunities for faithful witness and service.

On Sunday nights we will also offer **DISCIPLE 3: REMEMBER WHO YOU ARE** led by the incredibly gifted **Stephanie Butler.** The driving idea in this study is the connection between memory and identity as the people of God. Participants in this 32 week study will read the major and minor Old Testament prophets, with the exception of Daniel, and will read the thirteen Letters traditionally attributed to Paul. Several themes weave their way through the study – the call to re-

member; the call to repentance; the need for renewed vision; and the place of community. The prophets and Paul are continually calling hearers and readers back to their God and to a sense of who they are as a people "set apart".

We will be announcing, in late July, the day/time, location, and starting date of each of the **Disciple** classes. Also, if anyone is interested in leading a Disciple Class that is not being offered or leading one of the **Disciple Bible Studies** at a different time of the week, please contact Tony Moreau.



BEGINNING IN AUGUST

Coming in September, **COVENANT BIBLE STUDY!** Covenant is an in-depth group Bible study in which participants read and discuss the Bible together, learning how to love God –and each other, better. Three 8-episode (week) segments each explore a different aspect of Covenant life. Each will examine what Covenant means, and the progression of a Covenant relationship with God.

**CREATING:** Examines how the Covenant community is created and established.

**LIVING:** Focuses on how the community lives out their Covenant in faithful love—how it's applied to actual relationships in everyday life.

**TRUSTING:** Looks at the crises that sometimes call Covenant life into question, and how we are restored to trust in God when troubling things happen.

Tony Moreau, one of Mt. Zion's Associate Pastors will lead COVENANT twice weekly on Wednesday evenings at 6:30 pm and on Thursday mornings at 10 am beginning on September 21st and 22nd. When I consider a vision for the Oasis Sunday School Class, I pray that it will be a community in which you will encounter the Living Water that is Jesus Christ. An enticing weekly gathering that overshadows the hustle, bustle, and stresses which are often a part of daily life and that offers an encounter with and revitalization by the Holy Spirit. 
