Dear friends at Mt. Zion,

Happy new year!

Yes, for the most important way to calculate time, it is the new year.

The CHRISTIAN year calculates time based on the life of Christ. So the CHRISTIAN year begins 4 Sundays before Christmas with the Advent Season where we prepare for Christ’s birth.

Like everyone else, there are ways we honor the calendar year. The calendar year is the term for terms of service for officers of the church. Newly elected officers begin their terms in January. The calendar year is the time frame for the budget of the church. (All contributions to the church must be received or postmarked by December 31!) So the calendar year is important.

In the United Methodist Church, we also honor the conference year (which is July 1 – July 1). Appointments of pastors are based on the conference year. Every pastor and family knows what it is like to live by the conference year. It is very important for us.

We have an eye to all the markers of new beginnings. New beginnings are a reminder of God’s grace and invitation to grow, improve and “move on to perfection”.

The church chooses to order the life of worship by the Christian year as a way of modeling our primary focus: to keep Christ first. So, while it may seem odd to hear us say “Happy New Year” in early December, the Christian year is always a reminder that the goal of the church is to be in lock-step with Christ, not the world around us. Romans 12 (which I hope you read every day) reminds us, “Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind.....” (Romans 12:2)

Observing the Christian year is our way of witnessing that in church, we put Christ first. With determination and intention, we say that our life is ordered around the life of Christ—from his coming as a baby in Bethlehem to honoring Him as conquering King and Lord of Lords. So go ahead and celebrate the new calendar year on January 1. But let the Christian year be the call – and holy reminder—to order our lives around Christ. His coming to our hearts makes all the difference. Blessed new Christ-centered year, *Mary John*



November activities and celebrations are reminders to count our blessings.

The Prayer Walk is one way to pray for the many blessings of Mt. Zion.

Using the Prayer Walk guide, people are encouraged to begin at the Sanctuary and follow the path on the map of the main campus. There are 8 places marked as stops for prayer, beginning at the steps of the Sanctuary, walking down by the cemetery to the Education Building, Family Life Center, the Hut, the Outdoor Chapel and Prayer Labyrinth and back up to the Youth House. At each stop, people are invited to remember the ministry that takes place there and say a prayer. Prayers are provided in the guide to read as well.

The Prayer Walk can be taken anytime by individuals, by friends walking together or by groups. We encourage people to actually take the walk physically, but the Prayer Walk guide could also be used by individuals or groups as a devotional way to pray around the church without walking.

Did you know... 1 in 68 children (1/42 boys, 1/189 girls) is diagnosed with Autism (a developmental disability). **Autism, or autism spectrum disorder**, refers to a range of conditions characterized by challenges with social skills, repetitive behaviors, speech and nonverbal communication, as well as by unique strengths and differences. There are many different types of autism. Approximately 1/2 of individuals diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder have average or above average IQ. Less than 1/3 of people with autism have an intellectual disability and 1/3 remain nonverbal. Autism:
affects 1 in 68 children (1 out of 42 boys and 1 out of 189 girls)
is one of the fastest-growing developmental disorders in the U.S.
costs a family \$60,000 a year on average
Has no medical detection or cure

THE ROOM IN THE INN is a ministry that Mt. Zion participates in during the winter months in partnership with the Urban Ministry Center. The simple goal is to keep homeless people from freezing on cold winter nights. Every 1st and 3rd Tuesday night from December – March we will provide housing and food for 10 people who are homeless. We do this by opening the doors of our Youth House and our hearts to a population of homeless people that continues to grow here in our own community. Something as simple as sharing a meal and a conversation could be one of the most rewarding experiences for you and the Neighbors!

Each week there are a number of things that need to come together to make this ministry successful ... and that is where you come in! We need volunteers! There are many ways that you can serve: cooking a warm meal, providing breakfast, packing a bag lunch, driving the church mini bus, doing laundry, staying overnight and more. Please prayerfully consider giving your time and talents this year especially if you have never participated in Room in the Inn.

We also have a wishlist of things that we need for this ministry: Paper products (paper towels, toilet paper, and napkins), Cleaning supplies (Windex, Clorox wipes, sponges, kitchen cleaner, etc.), Laundry and dishwashing detergent, fabric softeners, ground coffee (regular & decaf), tea bags, and hot cocoa packets, Chapstick, travel size lotion, travel size deodorant (men's & women's), razors & shaving cream (men's & women's), toothbrushes, toothpaste, combs, travel size soap, children's books (reading, coloring, stickers, etc.), CFL light bulbs, silverware and cereal bowls. Due to generous donations and limited space, we **CANNOT** accept shampoo, conditioners or soap at this time. Donations can be dropped off at the youth house.
