Join us as we begin the season.





Wednesday Night @ The Mount Worship Lenten Sermon Series



YOUTH MINISTRY NEWS (FUEL)

What are we learning in FUEL?

In February we started a 7-week series on How To Pray. The series is loosely based on the popular book by Andrew Murray, With Christ in the School of Prayer. Each week we take New Testament teachings about prayer and illumine them in "lessons" designed to help the student move past shallow, ineffectual prayers into a fuller understanding of the work that God has called them to do. According to Murray, the church does not realize that "God rules the world by the prayers of his saints, that prayer is the power by which Satan is conquered, that by prayer the church on earth has disposal of the powers of the heavenly world." Students are challenged each week to complete assignments to cultivate this spiritual discipline of prayer, and seek to employ Works of Piety in their daily lives. Below is a prayer, a student wrote following a FUEL night:

Gracious God. You are amazing and powerful. You turn the sick healthy and the poor stable. In heaven all things are good as you turn them. Thank you for all the daily needs you provide. Please help bring water to those who are less fortunate. Please forgive our sins and help us to forgive those who have sinned upon us. It is our nature to sin and you are gracious to forgive us. 


